Stickford Ladies Social Circle are still wanting a lot more poppies to decorate the war memorial for Remembrance Day. Below are patterns for either knitting or crochet. If you are able to help, please contact Jennie Hamer, 01205 480195. Thank you.

Knitted poppy pattern

Cable cast on 60 stitches

Work 10 rows stocking stitch

Row 11 - knit two together to the end of the row

Row 12 - slip a stitch, knit 2 together and pass the slip stitch over. Follow this until the end of the row.

Cut your yarn; thread on a needle; pass the needle back through the remaining stitches and pull tight. Join edges to make a poppy. Sew black button through the middle of the poppy.

Alternatively make centre with black wool.

Row 11, join black yarn and start knitting two stitches together to the end of the row.

Row 12 slip a stitch, knit 2 together and pass the slip stitch over. Follow this until the end of the row.

Cut your yarns; thread on a needle; pass the needle back through the remaining stitches and pull tight. Join edges to make a poppy and secure ends.

Crochet poppy pattern

With black wool, chain 6 & join to first chain with a slip stitch to form a loop

Into any stitch work ch2 as first dc. Work one dc into same stitch.

Into next stitch work 2 dc and repeat this, working 2dc into every stitch = 24 stitches.

Join with a slip stitch into the second chain stitch you did at the beginning of the round.

Now work out first petal – this to be repeated 4 times to make 4 petals.

1. Ch2, counts as first dc, into next stitch work 2 tr.

- 2. Work 2tr into next stitch. 3. 2 tr into next stitch. 4. 2tr into next stitch = 8 tr crochet stitches.
- 5. 1dc into next stitch = 10 stitches = 1 petal
- 6. 1dc into next stitch is the start of your next petal repeat 1-5 three more times.

Complete the 4th petal with a slip stitch into the first ch2 of the first petal. Cast off.

REMINDER
