War Memorial Clock.

Following on from my update in the March newsletter I am very pleased to report that the project for restoration of the clock has been completed. It has been over a year in the planning, but our objective has been achieved to have the clock fully operational again for this year's centenary. It has been fully restored and repaired as required to include three new working gears as the old ones were either worn or damaged and new cables. The repair works are guaranteed for twelve months, all new parts made by the restorers are guaranteed for ten years against failure through faulty workmanship or materials. Any parts not made by the restorers have the manufacturers own warranty.

The project has been fully funded by donations and a grant. The Parish Council has not made a financial contribution towards the cost but arrangements are being made with the restorers for an annual maintenance contract which the Parish Council will pay for, but we hope to reduce the cost by having our inspection carried out with others in our area. This is to safeguard the future running of the clock.

The project could not have been carried out without the very kind and generous donations by three people so a big thank you to them and the grant providers FCC Communities Foundation so again a big thank you to them. FCC award grants to community projects from funds donated by FCC Environment through the Landfill

Communities Fund, previously known as WREN. A big thank you also to Cheryl for obtaining the grant and dealing with the formalities for it which were not straightforward at times!

All the clock parts were returned to site in two visits, the top parts including the dials on 29th May and the full workings on 1st June. Prior to return, all the workings were fully tested in the workshop for three weeks. On return to an outside environment, we were told to expect some issues. The clock stopped at 6.50 on 5th June which I initially thought was a winding issue, but it then stopped again at 6.37 on 12th June and 6.40 on 13th June. At that time, it was also losing a minute a day. I telephoned the restorers at 10 a.m. on 14th June and they were with me at the clock by 2 p.m. the same day. Prior to arriving at the site, they thought they were aware of what the problem was with the clock stopping around the same time. This was due to the counterbalance slightly touching the tower; correcting works were done to the connecting rods, the strike cable and time settings. All of the workings were fully inspected over a ninety minute stay since which we have not had any problems. Excellent service from the restorers Time Assured Limited.
