#### **CENTENARY OF** STICKFORD CLOCK TOWER WAR MEMORIAL 1923 - 2023

There will be waterfalls of poppies made by local people, on 2 sides of the memorial



On Sunday 12th November at 10.45 am an act of remembrance will be held at the War Memorial to remember the people from this area who gave their lives in the two World Wars. This will be a special occasion as it is exactly 100 years since the memorial was unveiled in 1923.

The service will continue in Stickford Community Centre, where everyone will be welcome.

Following the service at the War Memorial and the one in the Community Centre there will be a buffet lunch. This will be provided by Grandma's Pudding Company from Friskney in the Community Centre, the cost of which will be paid for from funds held by the Parish Council left over from monies allocated for the Jubilee and Coronation celebrations and also from the fundraising events for the Jubilee.

From 10.00 a.m. until 12 noon there will be temporary traffic restrictions on Fen Road and Cole Lane to enable people to congregate safely around the War Memorial. Half of Fen Road and Cole Lane will be coned off around the War Memorial although access will be available for residents and emergency vehicles. There will be a temporary speed restriction of 10 m.p.h. There will be marshals in place to look after the safety of everyone. Please respect the arrangements that have been made.

#### Friends of St Helen's

2023 saw our group continue working on the church and churchyard. Early in the year, we set hedglings along the east and north side of the church yard. Some members helped Darren and Lesley to cut the grass in the summer whilst others edged and exposed the public footpath running from east to west. A plan for 2024 is to expose the footpath from the main gate to the east side's public footpath entrance! A survey of the church exposed a damp problem on the north wall and to help alleviate this problem, a small hillock was removed, and a short Dutch drain excavated. This will hopefully stop rainwater permeating the church wall. Another job undertaken was to chip away old mortar on the exterior walls to stop rainwater forming and permeating into the building too.

The yew tree next to the gate has been trimmed, thanks to Dorian with his trusty chainsaw, and branches etc. removed by some of the group. The overgrown hedge on the east side has also received some attention too!!
