First of all, a Happy New Year to you all even though we are now into February.

As you will have hopefully noticed, the new bus shelters and noticeboard are now in place. A thank you to Karl Sharpe of Sharpe Fabrications for a great job.

The Parish Council's next meeting is on **Tuesday 12**th **March**. We are organising a meeting with Lincolnshire Resilience, date will be advertised, to get a village emergency plan into place for the village. Once the plan is in place, we will need volunteers from the village to help when the time comes to need it. Following the floods in October it has highlighted a need for it. We are in the process of ordering sand bins and sand that will be placed at the end of Church Road where the recycle bins used to be.

We will be placing a reminder of Parish Council meetings on Next Door and the Facebook Stickford Community Page going forward.

We work closely with our ELDC and LCC Councillors and thanks goes to Cllr Terry Taylor for the grant for the sand bins and sand and Cllr Wendy Bowkett for ensuring Fen Road and the Cul De Sac now have a decent road surface to drive on. We are now pushing for more roads in the village to be resurfaced so please bear with us as we move forward. But in the meantime, the more residents that put problems on Fix my street, this helps our cause greatly if more people report the same problem.

If there is anything that you feel the Parish Council needs to be looking at or working on please let us know.

Finally, we still have vacancies for Co-opted councillors to come and join us. If you feel that getting involved in the day to day running of village life is for you, please come along to a meeting and we can have an informal chat to discuss.
