Stickford Community Centre

We have been running since 1992 for use as a Community Centre for the local people of Stickford. Since the year 2002 we have undergone massive refurbishment (not always visible, like rewiring) to include kitchen, toilets, flooring, disabled access and more. Most recently we have had a new central heating boiler; a new suspended ceiling and more energy efficient lighting. So, we are looking really good.

The monies to carry out these refurbishments have been sought and granted, amongst strong competition from other village halls, and this has been down to Cheryl Steele. Cheryl has decided to retire as Chairperson of the Committee but will still be involved in Stickford Local History Group, St Helen's Church, Stickford and the Village Newsletter. The Committee would like to thank Cheryl for her diligence and tenacity with regards to successful fundraising and for all the hours she has given to the Community Centre.

The Community Centre is run by a small group of volunteers who work hard to organise and run events and maintain this building for the benefit for the Community of Stickford. If you would like to be part of this team in any way for example, like helping with refreshments; running a fundraising event or even help moving furniture, etc then please contact Ann French on 07787 956889.

As a Community Centre, we are not funded by public money. Our monies come from usage (the people, groups and companies that hire the hall); fundraising through the events we hold such as The Quiz or Bingo nights and by lobbying for funding from various sources. Without these things we would not exist.

The Relief in Need Charity makes cash grants at Christmas to pensioners, single parents, disabled people and anyone else living in the parish who is in financial need. Following a recent large increase in the cost of the charity bus, the Charity Trustees are now only able to fund a bus once a month rather than twice a month as for many years. A request is to be put to the Parish Council in November for top up funding to allow the twice a month service to resume but in the meantime, following consultation with those using the bus in June, it has been decided to alternate between Boston and Horncastle and to go on the 2nd Wednesday in one month to Boston and the 2nd Thursday in the next month to Horncastle.
